**WALTER E. AFIELD, M.D.**

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Dr. Afield received his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Pennsylvania and his Medical Degree from Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He did a year of Internal Medicine at Emory University's Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta and four years of residency in Psychiatry at a variety of hospitals associated with the Harvard Medical School. These include the Boston Psychopathic Hospital, Boston Children's Hospital and the Massachusetts General Hospital. He was a Teaching and Research Fellow in Psychiatry at the Harvard Medical School and a Lecturer in Social Relations at Harvard University. In 1967 he returned to Johns Hopkins where he was an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry and Assistant Professor of Pediatrics. In 1970 he moved to Tampa as Professor and Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry at the newly formed University of South Florida Medical School. He did that until 1974 when he went into full time private practice. From 1985 to 1992 he was the Medical Director of AccessCare, a Managed Care Organization. He is a Diplomat of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in two specialties. He is certified by the American Psychiatric Association in Mental Health Administration. He is also certified by the American Board of Utilization Review and Quality Assurance, the American Board of Hyperbaric Medicine, and the American Board of Disability Analysts. He has been an examiner for the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in all three specialties. He is currently on the staff of major hospitals in Tampa. He has been a physician since 1960 and is licensed in Maryland, Massachusetts, California and Florida. He is a member of the American Medical Association, the American Academy of Neurology and other National Organizations. He has lectured extensively throughout the country. He has testified before the United States Congress concerning standards of appropriate care. He has held Visiting Professorships throughout the country.

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
